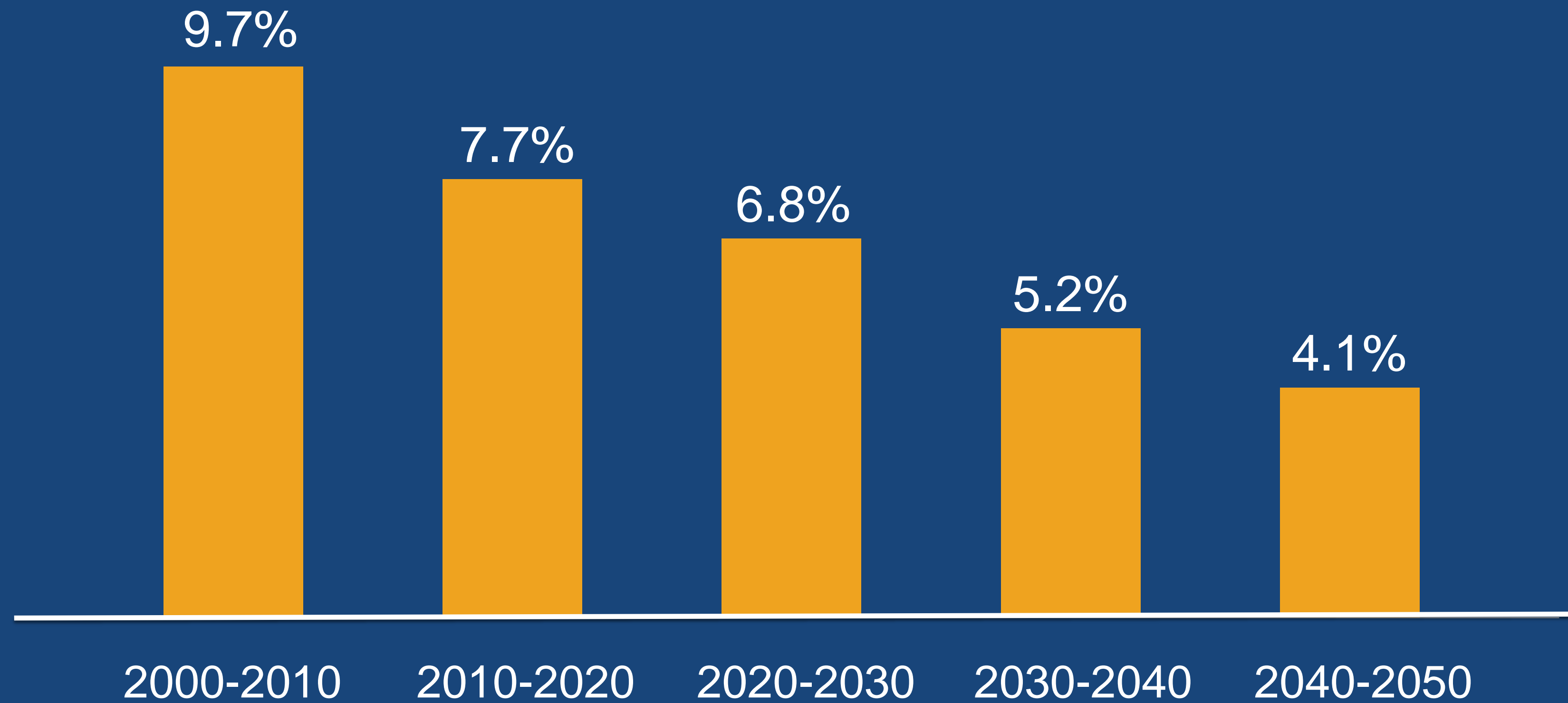

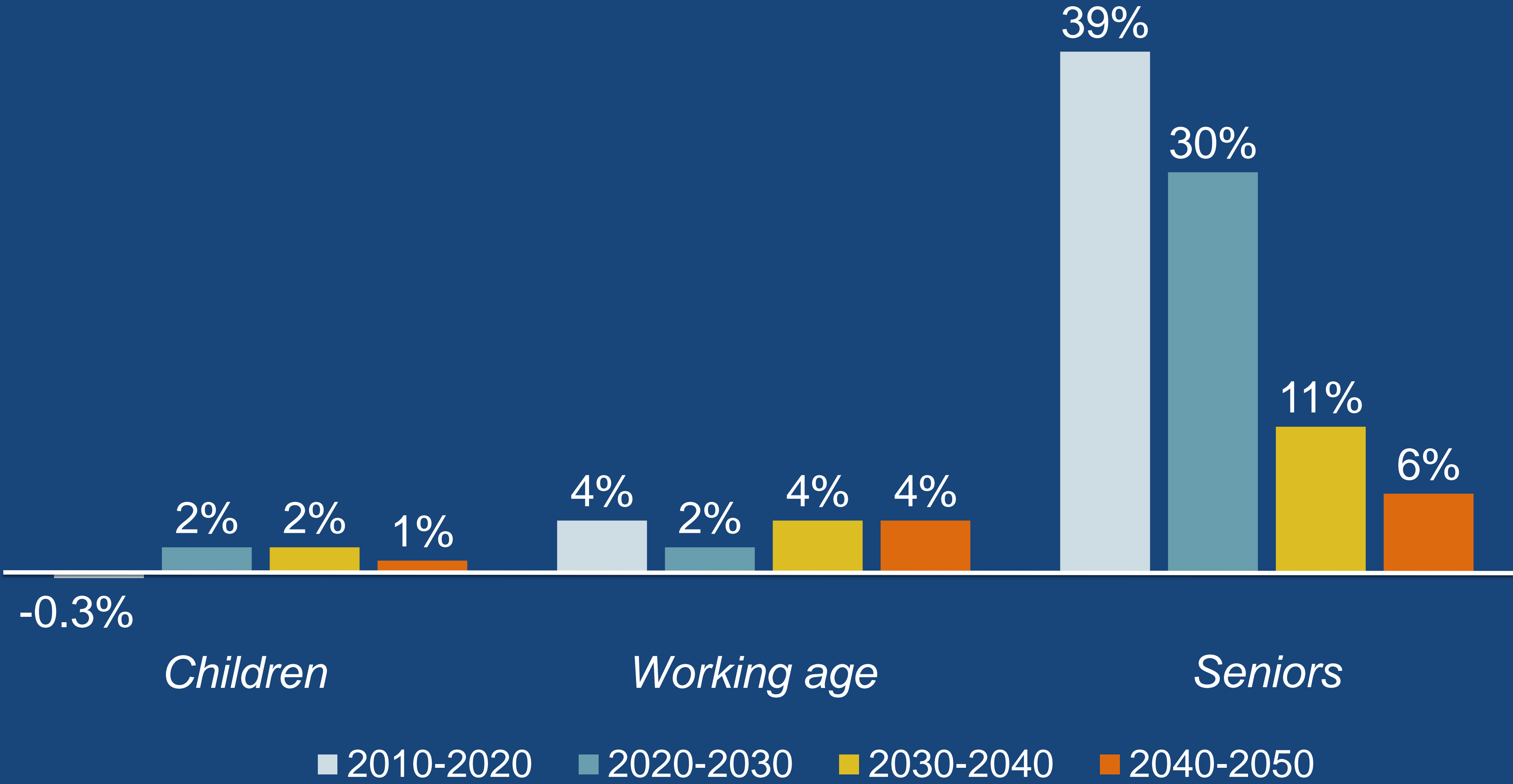

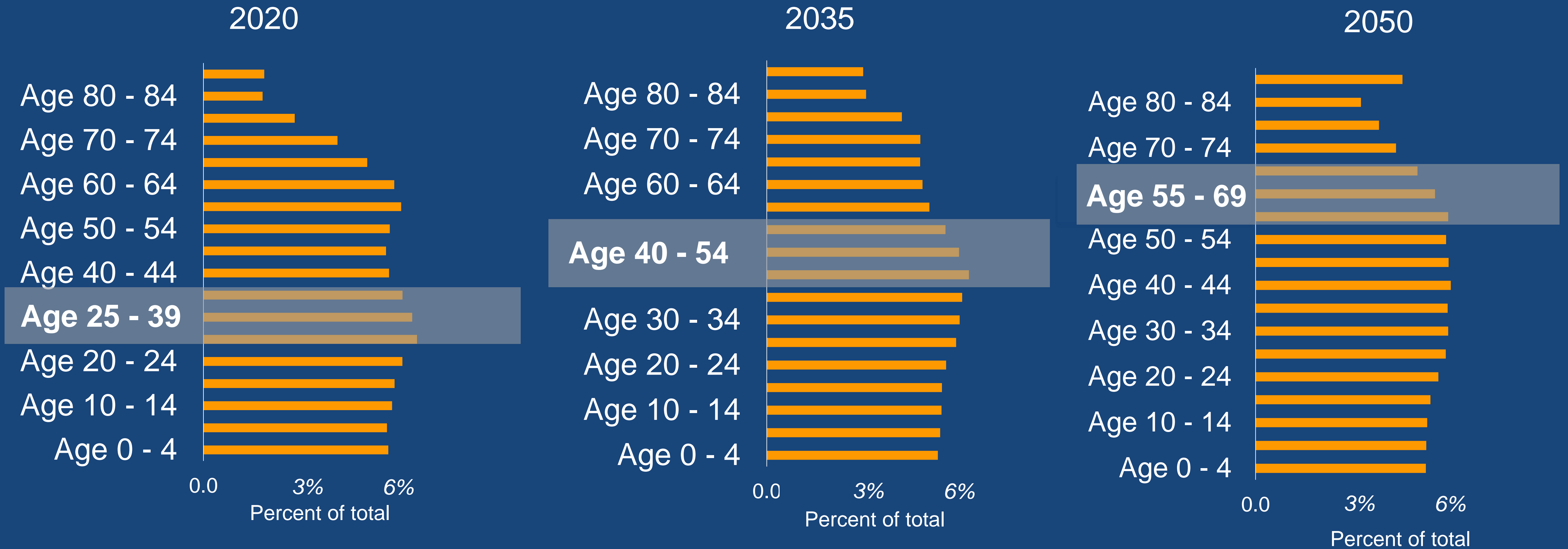
U.S. population growth, 2010 - 2050

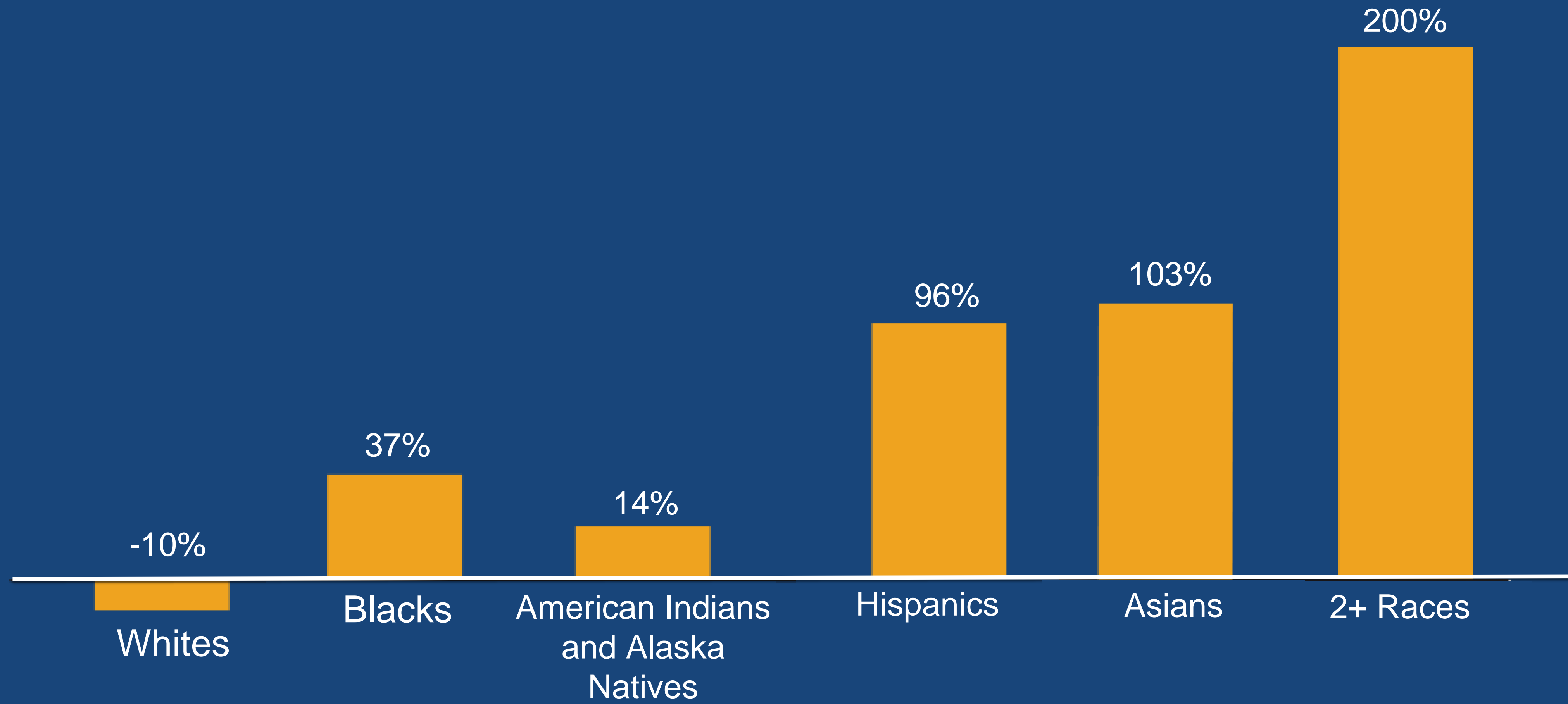
Aging of the Millennial Population

Projected Growth - Racial Groups: 2015 – 2060



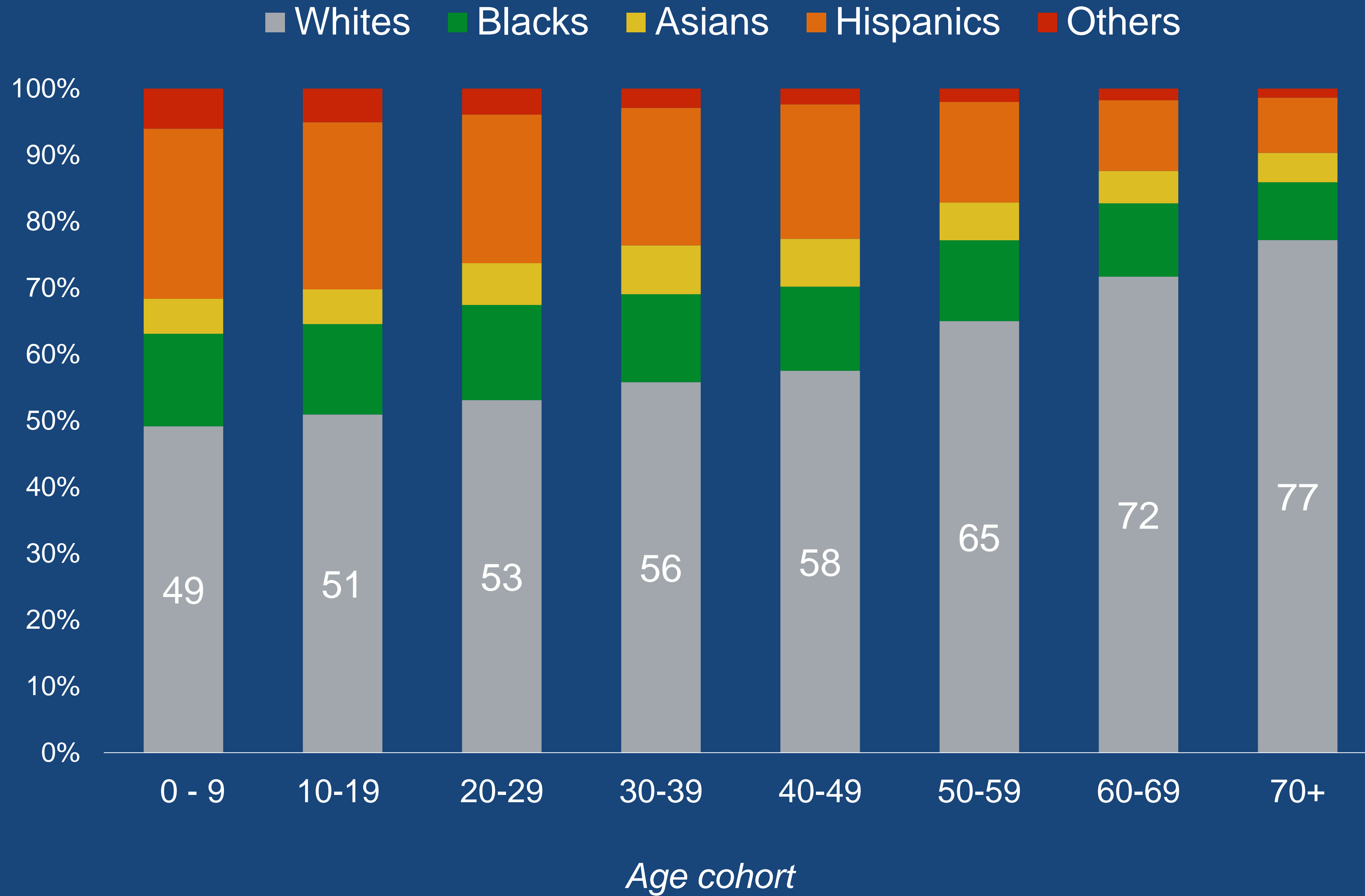

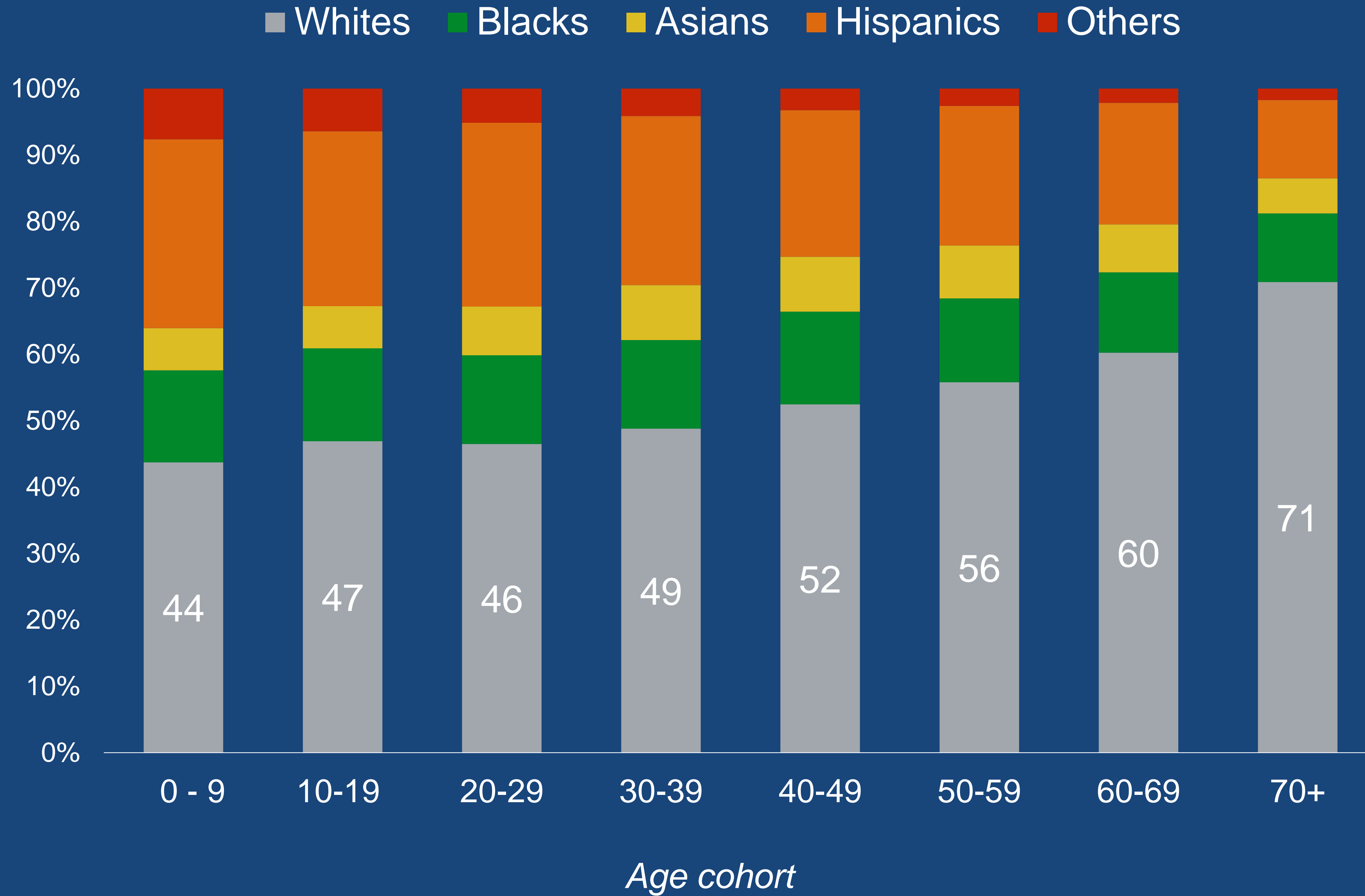


U.S. race profiles by age: 2020

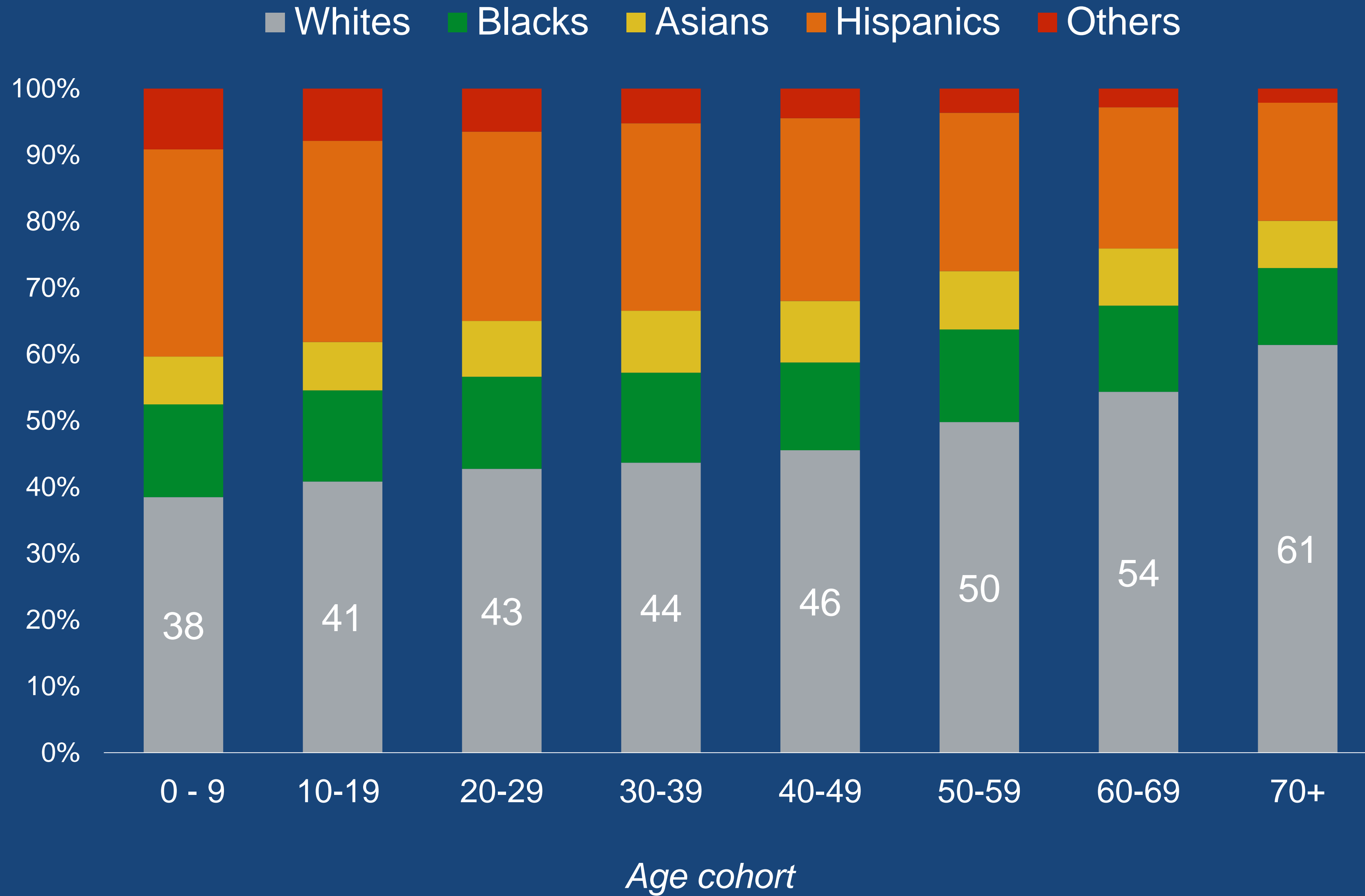
U.S. race profiles by age: 2035

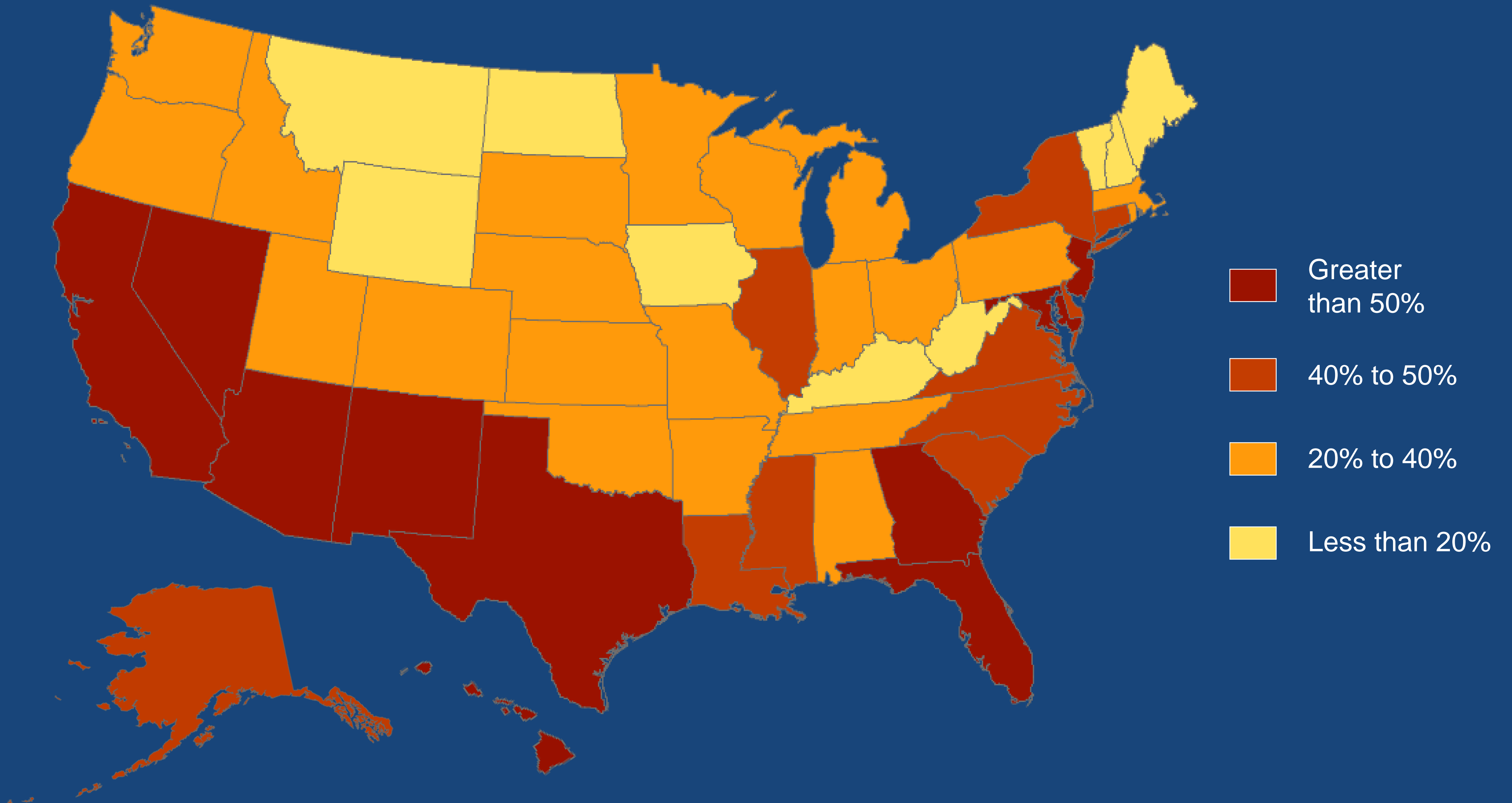
U.S. race profiles by age: 2050

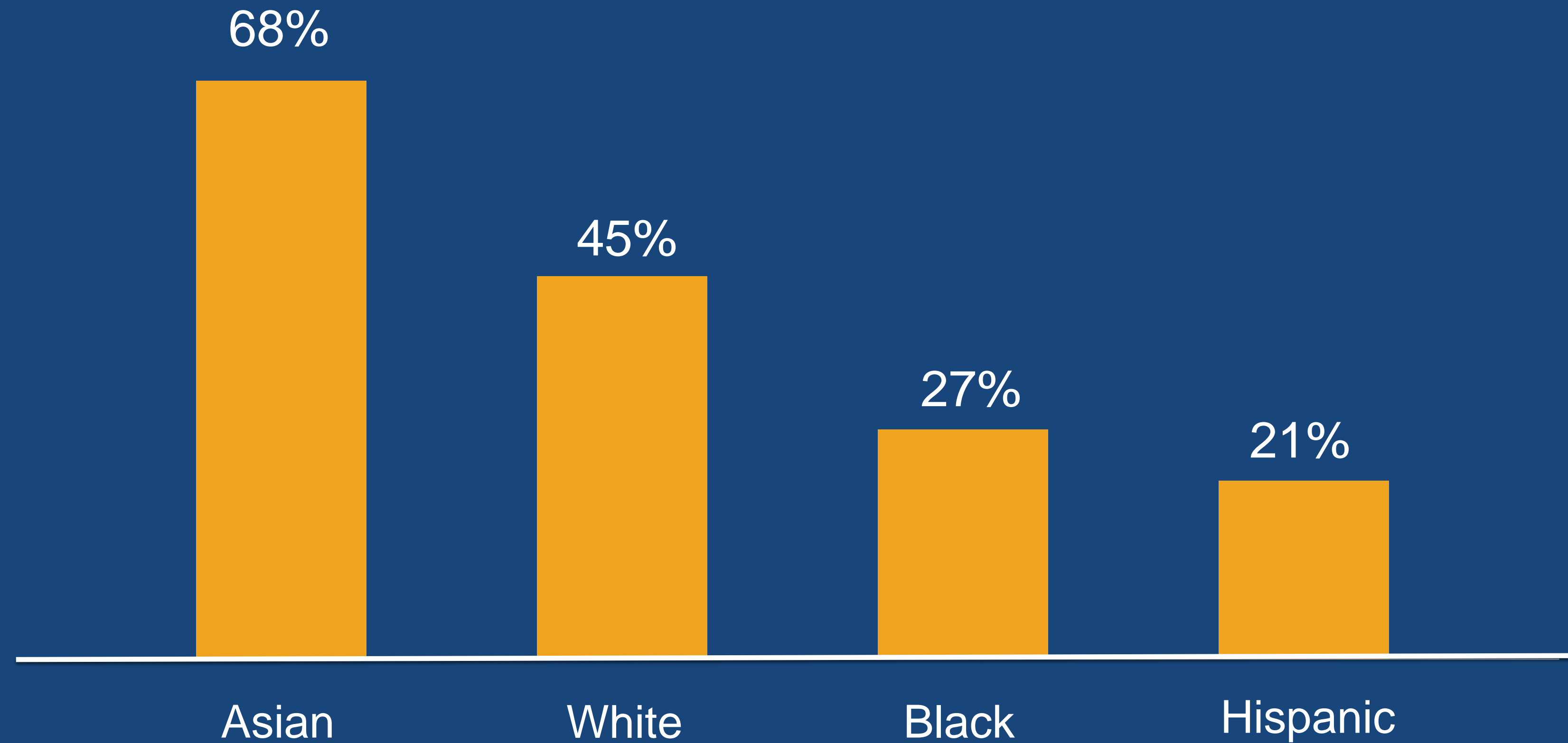


Millennials: minority shares of state populations

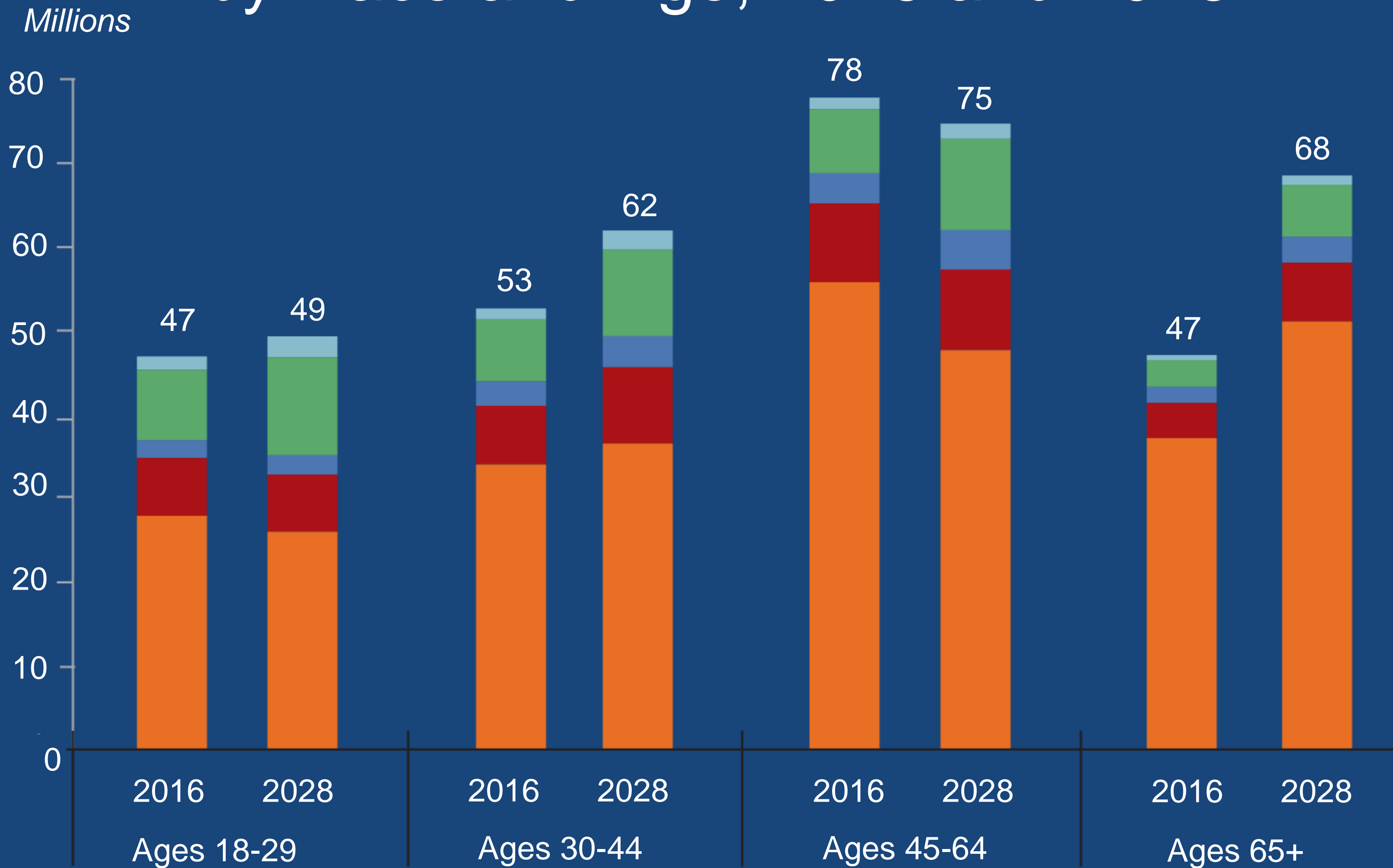
